Visitor information on the safety concept

The safety concept relies on visitors taking responsibility and showing solidarity and is being implemented and supplemented on the construction site tours by means of various measures.

In an attempt to stop the further spread of COVID-19, we would also ask you not to plan an excursion if you have not felt well in the last 14 days or are currently suffering from a high temperature (fever), a cough or other cold and flu symptoms. FAQ

Number of participants

The maximum number of participants has been reduced from 20 to 10. This makes it easier to maintain the distancing rule and avoid bottlenecks during the tour.

Use of the cloakroom

To ensure safety levels are maintained while using the cloakroom, visitors are kindly requested to enter the cloakroom only with people they know or with people from the same household and in groups of maximum four people.

Cleaning of safety helmets and vests

Safety helmets and vests will be disinfected after every tour.

Construction site tour guides

The construction site tour guides are trained in the deployment of protective measures and must comply with the safety concept.

Contact tracing

If a participant falls ill with the coronavirus after the construction site tour, they will be requested to inform the Albula Railway Museum immediately (see contact details above). The railway museum will then get in touch with the other group members in compliance with data protection law, so that they can notify their travel companions and self-isolate. Spontaneous visitors will not be allowed to join the group.

Protective masks and hand sanitiser

It is advisable to wear a face mask during the construction site tour. Masks and hand sanitiser can be provided at the meeting point on request.
